



FlipGrid Lesson Ideas

As An Informal Assessment

- Use a text or video prompt as an exit ticket or homework assignment. Students can upload their responses from anywhere via the FlipGrid app on their phone.
- Have students watch a video or read a prompt, then summarize the information in their own words.

As a Collaboration Accountability Tool

- Have students define their group roles via video, so there's no question that they understand their roles.
- Have students describe their role within the finished group product.
- Students can pitch their ideas to one another, or refine their ideas via responses

As a Class Discussion

- Load a prompt (video/text) and have students record their opinion. Make them back it up with evidence from your content. If you have the paid version, you can require students to reply with a rebuttal to one another.
- If you're brave, open up a grid as a class evaluation; let your students tell you what worked, what they liked, and what they didn't.

As an Icebreaker

- Have students upload an "About Me" video.
- Have a virtual "Show & Tell" post. (Kids LOVE this one!)
- Invite your students to participate in a "class challenge." (Think ice bucket, or bottle flipping, etc.)
 - *Note: this keeps them doing this OUTSIDE of your class, instead of during class!
- Sing a song. Find out who your class superstars are quickly with this challenge!
